What is Title I?

Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965 reauthorized as No Child Left Behind (NCLB) in 2001.

Refer to <u>Improving Basic Programs Operated by Local Educational Agencies (LEA)</u> by the U.S. Department of Education.

Title I includes these major parts:

- 1. Title I, Part A: Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged
- 2. Title I, Part C: Migrant Education
- 3. Title I, Part D: Services for Neglected or Delinquent Children and Youth

What are the Goals of Title I?

- Help students to achieve academic success in Reading/Language Arts and Mathematics;
- Increase student performance in high poverty schools through school-wide reform;
- Build teacher capacity through quality professional development; and
- Enhance parents' abilities to help their children succeed through quality parental involvement activities.
